





2025 Rural Ambassador Award

Anna Henville

Hi I'm Anna and I'm honoured to be Northampton's Rural Ambassador for 2025.

I was brought up on the family farm at West Binnu and spent my primary years at Binnu Primary School, where my family were fully involved in the community. We enjoyed lots of activities: Scout bike rides and picnics, P&C fundraisers, tennis club events, school concerts and many more. I count myself lucky to have had such a supportive community around me and such a free-range childhood.

Although schooling wasn't easy for me, in was my time at Binnu that taught me resilience and the value of hard work. Both at school and at home we were expected to give 100% at whatever we did, be it doing a school assignment or shifting sheep. I have dyslexia, dysgraphia and ADHD so I would have taken sheep work over school work any day. I continued my schooling as a boarder at Nagle in Geraldton, where we lived as a strong community and made friendships for life.

I have never been a fan of the city, so when it came time to go to university I was lucky enough to be able to study locally in Geraldton through Geraldton University Centre and continue living on the farm. One of the great things about study in Geraldton was I was able to complete some of my teaching practicum in small country schools; Binnu PS and Saint Mary's in Northampton. I have also done a year teaching at Chapman Valley Primary School and am now a permanent early childhood Special Education teacher at Holland Street School.

I guess I'm not your average rural ambassador — I live in Geraldton now and am not directly involved in the agricultural sector, but I love the Northampton Show and my involvement in it. I have been an Exhibition Hall committee member for over ten years and Chief Steward of the Junior Section for the last three. A lot of country social life is centered around netball and footy, and I was not great at organised sports. As a kid the Show gave me a chance to show what I was good at — baking, crafts, visual arts and honed some life skills in the process — organisation, attention to detail, perseverance, volunteering…the list goes on.

As a teacher I encourage students to participate in hands-on activities to expose them to country life. Our school is lucky enough to have a kitchen garden and chickens, where we go out and explore where our food comes from. We are also partnered with "Kelpies for Kids" where kelpie puppies visit to become used to children and adults as they train to be working dogs. This exposes the kids to sheep work as we watch videos of the dogs training, which the students love.

The Northampton Show provides a chance for the students at Holland Street

School to enter arts, crafts and cooking into the Exhibition Hall, allowing them to participate in the community that they would not have had otherwise. I love that my passion for education, rural life and the Northampton Show have come together to create these opportunities.

It's great that our wonderful team of volunteers can create an event which showcases agriculture and also the skills and passions of all who live in the community. I'm proud to be a part of it.

REGULATIONS and CONDITIONS

ALL ENTRIES RECEIVED SUBJECT TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE ROYAL AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY OF WA AND ALSO THE FOLLOWING LOCAL RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- 1. Admission to Show Grounds: Adults \$20.00, Children under 16 years free.
- Senior Membership \$15, entitles the member to free admission to the Show and half entry fees for any entries. Ring entries excepted. Junior Membership (under 16 years) \$2, entitles the member to free entry to the Show and half entry fees for any entries. Ring entries excepted.
- 3. In the event of there being no competition in any class, prizes may be awarded if the judges certify to particular merit, but they are especially requested to withhold prizes even where there is competition, if the exhibits are of inferior quality or are not suitable for the class in which they have entered. The judges may award a second prize or make a highly commended award.
- 4. No stallions to be exhibited as hacks.
- 5. Childrens ages shall be determined on day of show.
- 6. All sheep and lambs to be shown in the wool, the number of days' growth to be stated in entry. Wethers as per class.
- 7. Exhibitors are requested to state age and pedigree of blood stock, and breed name on entry form.
- 8. All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor, and all products must be made or grown by the exhibitor.
- 9. Show jumping entries will be taken online via Global entries. Ring One entries will be received up to 15 minutes prior to starting time. Entrance fee must be paid in the ring. All Poultry entries close on Saturday 30th August. All remaining entries close at 2pm on the Thursday prior to the show.
- All Exhibition Hall exhibits (apart from LITERATURE, PHOTOGRAPHY and ART entries) to be delivered to the Northampton Community Centre Stadium (downstairs car park area) between 10am and 4pm Thursday 11th September and 8.00am and 10am Friday 12th September.
 - LITERATURE exhibits to be delivered to the show office prior to 2pm Tuesday 9th September.
 - PHOTOGRAPHY and ART entries to be delivered between 10am and 4pm Thursday 11th September, or prior by arangement.
 - Photography and Art exhibits WILL NOT be accepted on Friday 12th September.
- 11. Sheep must be on the ground no later than 8.00am on Show Day. Judging starts at 9.00am Stewards in attendance at 7.30am
- 12. Cages will be provided by the Society for Poultry Exhibits.
- 13. No two classes of Poultry to be shown in the same cage.
- 14. Ring Event judging will commence at 8am, Sheep, Wool, and Poultry judging will commence at 9.00am on show day..
- 15. All grain exhibits must be last season's growth.
- 16. Protests must be lodged with the Secretary before 2.00pm on Show Day, where practicable, accompanied by a deposit of \$10.00 to be forfeited if the Society deems protest frivolous.
- 17. Every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.
- 18. In the case of a dispute as the interpretation of any of the foregoing rules and regulations, the same shall be determined by the Committee.
- 19. Any person insulting or interfering with the Officials during the Show will be subject to removal from the ground, and prizes, (if any) awarded to such person may be absolutely forfeited to the funds of the Society.

- 20. It shall be the duty of the stewards to prevent any person from interfering with the judges and, if necessary, to order the removal of such offender.
- 21. Pens of more than one sheep cannot be broken to enable sheep to compete in individual sheep classes. Individual sheep cannot be entered in more than one class.
- 22. In all classes except ring events, where a special prize is given for a class, this prize will replace the ordinary prize, or if less, the amount will be made up to the amount, as shown on the top of the section.
- 23. In the event of a tie for the highest aggregate points in any section, prize allocated shall be won by the Exhibitor with the most first prizes. In the event of a further tie, prize allocated shall be won by the person with the most entries in the Section, if still equal, entries over the whole of the Exhibition Hall will be counted, if points are still equal, entries in the whole of the Show will be taken into consideration.
- 24. In all classes, the judge has the power to change an exhibit to another class within the Section if, in their opinion, it has not been entered in the right class.
- 25. Where the Society's ribbon is made available the judge is expected to award it to the best exhibit in the section.
- 26. All livestock found vermin infested will be removed from the grounds.
- (a) All entries received are subject to these Show Regulations and By–Laws, the Special Regulations in each Section, and to the Uniform By–Laws made under the Royal Agricultural Society Act, 1926;
 - (b) The Society may refuse any entry without giving any reason therefore;
 - (c) The Committee may at any time disqualify from exhibiting either indefinitely or for such a period as it may think fit, any exhibitor who has in the opinion of the Committee been guilty of any breech of these regulations, or whose conduct whether at or during any Show of the Society has in the opinion of the Committee been such that he is unfit to exhibit at any Show of the Society;
 - (d) No person who has been disqualified from exhibiting at any Show of the Royal Agricultural Society of Western Australia Inc, or at any show or Society affiliated therewith, shall during the period of disqualification be allowed to act as agent, representative or servant of any exhibitor at any Show of the Society, and the exhibitor of such stock shall be disqualified;
 - (e) During the period of disqualification no entry will be received from any person disqualified from the Royal Agricultural Society of Western Australia Inc, or by any Society affiliated therewith, and should an entry be accidently accepted, it shall be deemed to be void and the entry fee will be returned.
- 28. The Society will be under no liability for any loss or damage suffered by an exhibitor in respect of any property exhibited by him, whether caused by or attributed to the negligence of the Society, or any of its servants or otherwise whatsoever.
- 29. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by an exhibit or exhibitors; and it shall be a condition of entry that such exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnified against legal proceedings arising from such an accident.
